



10346NAT Certificate IV in Reiki Treatment Practice

Become a Reiki Practitioner and make it your career.

Reiki treatment is a non-invasive, hands-on complementary treatment practice found by many to be deeply relaxing. It does not involve pressure or manipulation and can be used on its own and in conjunction with conventional medicine and other complementary and alternative health practices. The aim of Reiki treatment is to promote the body's natural healing abilities, improve mood, health and wellbeing.

A number of research studies demonstrate the positive effects of Reiki in reducing pain, stress, depression and anxiety. The practice of Reiki as a treatment can also have value in assisting to create receptivity to other forms of treatment, where a person's anxiety might impair treatment effectiveness. Reiki treatment is increasingly accepted in health and community-care facilities including hospitals, hospices and cancer-support units around the world.

Entry Requirements

You need to have completed in-person training and initiation in Reiki 1 and Reiki 2 by a Reiki Master whose lineage of initiation is traceable to the founder of the practice, Mikao Usui.

Vocational Outcome

On successful completion of this course, the student will attain the Certificate IV in Reiki Treatment Practice. The core and elective units completed as part of this course are also transferrable to a range of Certificate and Diploma courses. So you can go on to gain additional qualifications in a shorter timeframe and less cost.

Method of Study

The course will be delivered via mixed mode delivery, combining both face to face introduction sessions with distance study to complete course work. If you have any concerns about the methods of study, please speak to the Institute prior to enrolment.

Course Assessment

During your course, you will be required to sit a range of assessments. These will include both practical and written. Your trainers will provide you sufficient information prior to each assessment activity to ensure you understand your requirements. Learning and assessment support assistance will be given to participants who experience learning difficulties.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of prior learning (RPL) is available. Past training, formal and informal and/or experience can be assessed and matched against the units of competency within this course. Talk to us prior to enrolment if you feel you are eligible for RPL.

Course Costs

The course costs include:

- All assessment activities
- Support throughout the course
- Re assessment if required (up to 2 attempts—you will be required to re-enroll into a unit if you fail to complete all assessments after the 2nd attempt)
